Digital Media Programs Prepare Teens for a Bright Future

The Muckenthaler Cultural Center is partnering with Anaheim Libraries and the Muzeo to provide STEAM programs for teens beginning this month. STEM education refers to a focus on the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. STEAM education incorporates the "A" for the arts – recognizing that to be successful in technical fields, individuals must also be creative and use critical thinking skills, which are best developed through exposure to the arts. These programs are designed to encourage, educate and prepare today's youth to pursue careers in STEM-related fields.

Students will work for 6 weeks on an art form and 6 weeks in a related digital form practicing career readiness skills, creative expression, and building a digital portfolio. Each of the three 12-week programs includes instruction from industry experts and a fieldtrip. The following classes will be held at Haskett Branch Library on Tuesdays and Thursdays and at Anaheim Muzeo on Mondays and Wednesdays. Class size is limited so be sure to register early.

Our newest online database offers self-paced language learning for 80 different languages, and English as a Second Language (ESL) taught


